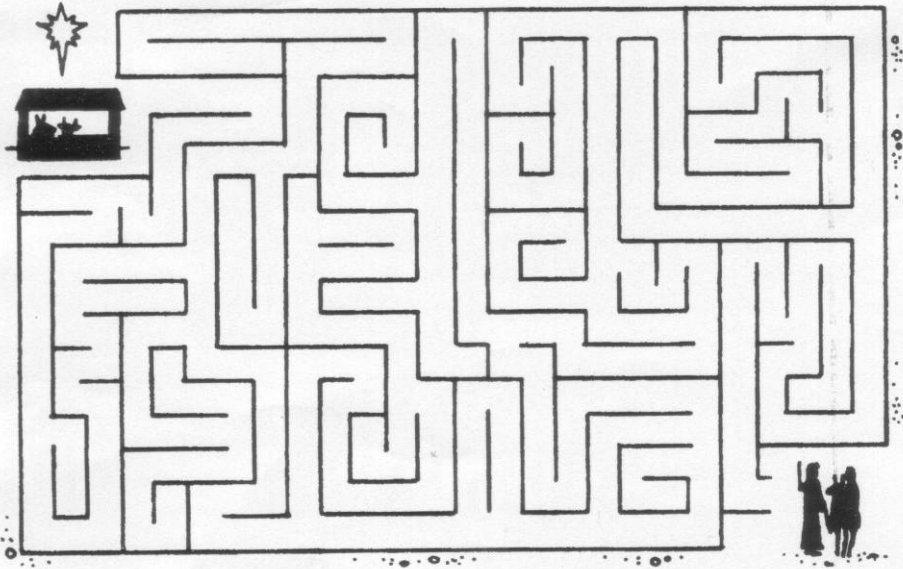
Bible study for Dummies

COME AND WORSHIP

A Special Pilgrimage

Recently I stood with a group of thirty other pilgrims on the Mount of Olives and looked at the magnificent view of Jerusalem stretched before us. We were reminded of how Jesus wept over the city and how I think He must still weep over such a divided place.

As we walked in Jesus’ footsteps, places, so familiar from our gospel reading, came alive to me in a new and vivid way. The highlight for me was the time spent by the Sea of Galilee. Having my Quiet Time standing in its waters as the sun came up had to be a special moment .We held a Communion Service on the shore and whenever in the future I sing “Dear Lord and Father of mankind” I shall be transported to that spot.

“O Sabbath rest by Galilee
O calm of hills above,
Where Jesus knelt to share with thee
The silence of eternity,
Interpreted by love.”.

Another moving site was the traditional site of our Risen Lord’s appearance to his disciples when he prepared breakfast for them and gave Peter the pastoral commission to “Feed my sheep” (John 21:9) A place where I would have liked to linger longer was the Garden of Gethsemane. Here close to the ancient olive trees which some botanists claim may be 3,000 years old we held a short service and sang “I stand amazed in the presence of Jesus the Nazarene.”.

I loved the visit to Mount Tabor, one supposed site of the transfiguration..Our leader read Matthew 17 and we remembered Jesus in all his glory.

This Christmas as we sing “While shepherds watched “ I will remember the beautiful church built in the shepherd’s fields of Bethlehem. We walked the Via Dolorosa, visited Nazareth, Cana, Capernaum, the River Jordan, Masada, Jericho and the Mount of Temptation and even floated in the Dead Sea .

Space prevents me from going into great detail but I feel very privileged to have visited the Holy Land. Eight days was not long enough and ideally I would like to return in the future.

However, wonderful though it is to have really walked where Jesus walked, I am reminded of Jesus' words to his first disciples to return to Galilee where he will be waiting for them. So I have had to return to my Galilee – Macclesfield – knowing that he is already here with me still and waiting for me to let him more and more into my life.
